## TVCC History

Treasure Valley Community College (TVCC) opened in 1962 with classes being held at Ontario High School in the evenings and on weekends. In 1965, TVCC moved to the current location with a single building on a 90-acre golf course gifted to the community. Several more buildings were added the following year and now TVCC boasts more than 50 degree programs, on-campus housing, 15 buildings which includes the John J Easley Gymnasium. In addition, TVCC boasts Elks Memorial Field, Heinz/Ore-Ida Sports Complex and Tennis Courts.

## Athletic Department History

TVCC is home to a competitive athletic program, represented by the Chukar mascot, with a rich history. Below are significant dates in which TVCC initiated athletic programs and joined conferences.

1965	TVCC launched Baseball as the first competitive sport.
1966	TVCC competed nationally under the NJCAA in the newly added Football, Basketball, Volleyball, Tennis, Wrestling, Golf, Softball, Track and Field, and Cross-Country programs.
2003	TVCC joined the NWAC with Baseball, Softball, Men and Women's Basketball.
2004	TVCC began competing in the NWAC in the revived Volleyball program and the newly added Men and Women's Soccer program.
2005	TVCC began competing in the NWAC in Men and Women's Tennis, Men and Women's Track, Men and Women's Cross Country, and Men and Women's Golf program.

Currently, TVCC is a member of the Northwest Athletic Conference (NWAC) and subject to its rules of eligibility. The TVCC Chukars compete against teams from Oregon, Idaho, and Washington. TVCC athletics now has 13 programs competing in the NWAC. Intercollegiate opportunities for TVCC Women include: soccer, volleyball, cross-country, basketball, tennis, track, softball, and rodeo. TVCC Men may participate in soccer, cross-country, basketball, baseball, tennis, track, and rodeo.

## EADA

## Athletically Related Student Aid - Men's and Women's Teams

Athletically related student aid is any scholarship, grant, tuition waiver or any other form of financial assistance offered by TVCC which require the recipient to participate in a TVCC athletic program. TVCC Men's athletic teams were awarded \$182,693 which account for 46% of the athletically related aid while the Women's athletic teams were awarded a total of \$210,663 which account for 54% of the athletic aid.
