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Do I need a license?

Generally, Oregon law requires anyone who works for compensation in any construction activity involving improvements to real property to be licensed.

Work that requires a license

Anyone who works for compensation in any construction activity involving improvements to real property needs a license. Examples include:

Roofing	Heating	Manufactured dwelling installation
Siding	Air conditioning	Land development
Painting	Electrical	Handyman
Carpentry	Plumbing	Home inspection
Floor covering	Tree servicing	Most construction and repair services
Concrete	Repair of attached appliances	

Work that does not require a license

Examples include:

Gutter cleaning

Power and pressure washing for the purpose of cleaning (siding, sidewalks, etc.)

Debris clean up (yard or construction site)

Qualified real estate property managers managing a building under a property management agreement.

Key deadlines

You must apply for your CCB license within 24 months of passing the test.

If you are already a contractor and your CCB license lapses for more than 24 months, you must retake training and pass the test again.

How long do I have to take the exam once I have been verified by TVCC?

There is no set time limit from to take the exam after you have been verified.

Licensing steps:

1. Determine the type (s) of structures you will work on.
2. Complete pre-license training and take the test.
3. File your corporation, LLC, and/or assumed business name.
4. Submit a CCB surety bond in the required amount (s).
5. Provide proof of general liability insurance in the required amount.
6. Obtain workers' compensation insurance if you will be hiring employees.
7. Obtain other employer account numbers.
8. Complete an application.
9. Submit your application.
