Technician

The Range and Forest Technician Career Pathway prepares students for entry level employment in range and forest management. Students will learn skills in range inventory and monitoring, forest measurements, watershed management and improvement, plant ID, recreation management, wildlife management, and basic fire effects. Range and forest management provides habitat for a variety of plant and animal species, clean water, and sustainable grazing. Students will learn to inventory, classify, and monitor range and forest conditions to maintain or improve the health of these natural resources. Students completing this certificate will be employable by several state and federal agencies as well as private industry.
