## ***Student Government***

The Associated Student Government represents students throughout campus, in the community, and at the state level. As the official voice of the students, Associated Student Government officers have a strong influence on institutional policy; they serve on governance councils, the Foundation Board, and are represented at the monthly Board of Education meeting. On these councils, officers have the opportunity to voice the questions, concerns and compliments of the student body. The Associated Student Government team has 10-in-10 initiatives in which the officers complete ten capital project in ten years.



## ***Student Activities***

The Student Activities team initiates, plans, and executes a variety of events and activities for students, staff, faculty, and the community. Students gain experience with event management, facilities coordination, public relations, and fiscal management. The activities team is comprised of coordinators who organize and manage special events, entertainment, intramurals, and lectures & awareness program.

## ***Clubs & Organizations***

Students have the opportunity to get involved with clubs and organizations through the Student Programs Department. Clubs at Treasure Valley encompass a wide range of cultural, academic, spiritual and community based interests. # STUDENT *Activities & Government*

Applications for the Associated Student Government team are accepted year round. However, the official selection process takes place during the spring quarter of each academic year. Applicants must be a full time student (12+ credits) and maintain a 2.5 quarterly and cumulative GPA. The President and Vice President positions must go through an election process and are then appointed by an election committee. All others officers must complete an interview process and are then selected for their position. After positions are filled, officers officially take office prior to each fall term.
