Campus Security

The College is committed to working with community agencies to reduce the opportunity for criminal/anti-social activities and providing a safe and secure environment for staff and students.

The Security Department is responsible for collecting data that may be necessary based on the mandates of the Jeanne Cleary Act.

Security and Access

The Board seeks to provide an atmosphere of openness for the encouragement of collegiate activity at College-controlled facilities. This must be balanced by controls on access which are designed to promote security in College facilities.

Reporting of a Crime or Other Emergency

College personnel shall cooperate fully with local, state and federal law enforcement agencies as they seek to protect life and property, to prevent anti-social behavior and preserve a secure environment in all college-controlled facilities. It is the responsibility of students and staff to report all crimes, even those considered minor, to the city police and the Security Department. All suspicious activity and other emergencies should be reported to the Security Department or another administrator, as promptly as possible. The President shall develop administrative regulations necessary to implement this policy and to meet the requirements of law.
